They've said people allergic to gluten should not use them but that the general reaction has been positive.



In France, disabled people are twice as likely to be unemployed as people without disabilities. A new chain of coffee shops in France has opened and is almost entirely run by staff with learning disabilities.

In Ilkley in the UK, a cafe set up as a charity by Ilkley Community Enterprise offers a similar service. Outside the Box café, provides unpaid work experience for adults with disabilities.

Initially open just at lunchtimes, the cafe became so popular that it's now open seven days a week, from 9am to 4pm!

## Probe launched to find quakes on Mars!

American space agency Nasa has launched its latest mission to Mars.

"InSight" will be the first probe to focus its investigations mainly on the inside of the Red Planet. Despite taking off last week, the probe won't reach Mars until November! Part of its work is to put testers on the surface to feel for "Marsquakes".

## World's largest glasshouse reopens!





Kew Gardens in West London is to reopen Temperate House which is the world's largest glasshouse after a fiveyear period of work.

More than 5,280 litres of paint was used, enough to cover four football pitches, and 15,000 panes of glass replaced! It is estimated that the work took over £40 million pounds to complete!

The house was opened to the public again on 5<sup>th</sup> May. The huge greenhouse is home to around 10,000 plants from warmer climates all around the world!
