I am pleased to say that we have had a fantastic start to the brand new year and all the children are working very hard, although some are still a little bit tired from all the festive family fun so a few early nights this week I think.

While we are thinking of getting ourselves back to school, can I remind

you all that the school needs to be secured for all children's safety at 8:50am, so please ensure that all pupils are in school by this time. We have seen an improvement in this area but know that there is still room for improvement. Our admin and Welfare team are still using valuable time chasing absences, escorting late children and recording everyone so please try to help us with this target.

In the last newsletter I told you all about some of the staff changes we have had in school recently. It is always hard when we have to say goodbye to staff who have been with us a long time and made such an impact on school however it makes it bitter sweet when new staff come along and brighten up your days. I am really pleased to see how quickly our new members of staff have settled in and have already began to make an impact on the children they are supporting. We have still had a number of complaints from local residents and other parents who have had their driveway blocked or nearly been knocked over by some parents who do not abide by this. We are extremely concerned about this issue and hope that families are able to walk into school safely without the concern of parking being a hazard. We have passed on all complaints to the police and they will be monitoring parking outside the school gates on a routinely basis.

Finally as we are now in a new term I just wanted to say a huge thank you to all of the parents and children who sent kind messages, cards and gifts for the staff over the festive period. They are not expected but very much appreciated by all, your kindness has been overwhelming. We hope you have all had a wonderful break with you families and look forward to a brand new term and year ahead of us.

We worked hard as a school to bring the magic of this time of year to the school and would like to thank parents for all of their thanks for the effort staff put into this time of year



We try not to close the school as we are very aware that child


