So we have come to the end of another academic year. I cannot believe where the time has gone!

It has been a rather busy year and as we come to our final day, I look back over the year - what has gone well and what can we develop further for the future?

Thinking back to the Autumn term the

children all settled in very quickly to their new classes, we welcomed another 90 children into reception and spent time planning lots of excellent learning opportunities for our children. We started the year with a theatre production of the Little Princess in KS2 followed by a visit from the Blunder Bus in KS1. Our fantastic range of clubs began and Enrichment also started with a key focus on reading to support the school's priorities. As we made our way into October the Year 6 pupils had a visit from the Zoo Lab, Reception visited Frankie & Benny's, Year 1 went on a visit to Hamerton Zoo, Year 5 to the Space Centre, Year 2 to Peterborough Museum and Year 6 also visited Woburn Safari Park. We took part in a range of sporting events such as Upper School Dodgeball tournament and Tag Rugby, In school we help Open Evenings and events for the curriculum, Interfaith Council and Eastern European coffee mornings. Each year groups across the school held workshops to support reading and invited parents in to breakfast meetings with the children. As we made our way into November the Year 3 children performed a wonderful Harvest Assembly, Year 6 had a Greek day, we had two Parents Evenings, Year 3 and 6 enjoyed some workshops on World War 2 and Year 3 were evacuated to Stibbington. And to end the term in December we had the Healthy Schools Christmas Bingo, Southfields Christmas Crafts, a Pantomime of Cinderella for the whole school (with ice cream...yum), a total of 12 productions during the Christmas period, the Talent show, Christmas dinner, Christingle service and even a visit from Santa himself. Wow that was a busy start the year!

We began the Spring term and got stuck straight in to many sporting events including the Sportshall Athletics and Gymnastics competitions. We celebrated Safer Internet Day and World Book Day and loved getting dressed up as our favourite book characters. We had a visit from the Conflux Theatre Group who ran workshops with KS1 and hosted the Valentines Disco. The Year 2 children went on their very first residential visit to Stibbington, Year 3 went to the 999 club, Woodgreen visited several year groups in school, Year 4 children went on a spellbinding mission to Harry Potter Studios, Year 3 went back in time at Flag Fen, Year 1 visited the Canal, Reception went to Sacrewell Farm, Year 5 went all Greek for a day and Year 6 spent time completing some Motivational Workshops. The Year 2 children performed a beautiful Mothers Day Assembly and after fundraising for Red Nose Day the Year 3 children went on their second residential to Aylmerton and Year 4 children to Horstead. To end the term we had lots of Easter fun with our Easter Egg Competition, Easter Service at the Church and a visit from a rather special bunny.

And then we made our way into the final term. The Autumn saw us work towards the children's Year 6 and Year 2 SATs in addition to the Year 1 phonics screening assessments. We had our unexpected visit from Ofsted and since have dusted ourselves off and have made our plans to develop our school further. As always we really value your opinions about our school. To help us further develop, we would like to ask you to give us your opinion about the school.

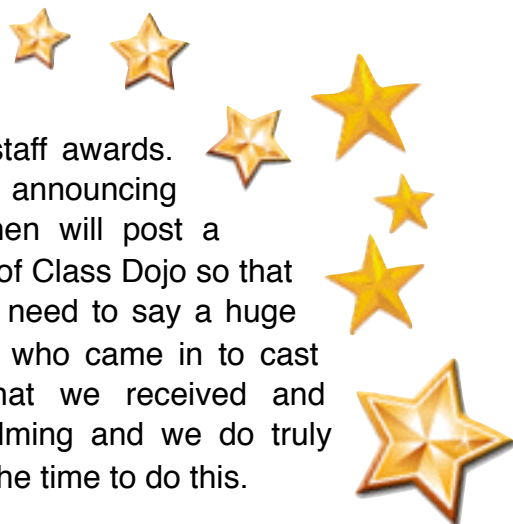
Please can I ask you to send Mrs King a Class Dojo message about things you like, the things you think we need to develop or any ideas you may have and we will try to use them in school.
